We would like to take a moment today to recognize the upcoming Juneteenth Day of Observance, also known as Emancipation Day. This holiday commemorates the day when enslaved people in Texas were finally granted their freedom, two years *after* the Emancipation Proclamation was signed. Juneteenth is an important day in our nation's history, and it is a time to reflect on the legacy of slavery and the ongoing struggle for equality and justice for African Americans. We encourage everyone in the Santa Monica College community to take some time to learn more about this significant time in history, and to participate in any local events/celebrations that may be happening in your area. Let us use this opportunity to come together as a community and continue the important work of building a more just and equitable society.

### History of Juneteenth:

On June 19, 1865, nearly two years after President Abraham Lincoln emancipated enslaved Africans and African Americans in America, Union troops arrived in Galveston Bay, Texas with news of freedom. More than 250,000 African Americans embraced freedom by executive decree in what became known as Juneteenth or Freedom Day. With the principles of self-determination, citizenship, and democracy magnifying their hopes and dreams, those Texans held fast to the promise of true liberty for all. (Source: The Smithsonian)
