PREPARATION FOR THE MAJOR

Coursework in social/behavioral/biological sciences, humanities, and language/rationality form the broad educational base for the practice of nursing. Coursework in the nursing major, taken in four semesters, prepares the student in nursing skill acquisition, knowledge and ability in the care, support, and management of illness states as well as the promotion of health. Nursing coursework includes clinical nursing laboratory experiences in a variety of clinical settings.

THE CURRENT ADMISSION CRITERIA ARE:

- ✓ An overall minimum grade point average of 2.7 for the Human Anatomy, Human Physiology, and Microbiology prerequisite courses, taken in the last 5 years, with no grade less than "C" for each course, and no more than <u>one</u> repetition/withdrawal in the group of courses. Only one repetition or withdrawal is allowed from all three of the pre-requisite science courses.
- ✓ College level, transferable English Composition, minimum of (3) semester units with a grade no less than a "C".
- ✓ A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.7 for ALL college coursework.
- ✓ Good standing status at Santa Monica College (academic and in-progress).
- ✓ Must take and achieve the required score on a CA Chancellor's Office approved Admissions Assessment.
- ✓ Meet the minimum physical qualifications & essential functions. See Essential Functions Required of Nursing Students.
- Must pass a criminal background check and drug test.
- ✓ Students must have a valid Social Security Number or Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN).

Students should be prepared to spend approximately \$1,000 the first semester for books, equipment, uniforms, and tuition. The estimated cost of the entire Nursing Program over two years is \$3,000-\$4,000.

ENROLLMENT IN THE NURSING PROGRAM IS OPEN TO PERSONS REGARDLESS OF SEX, AGE, MARITAL STATUS, DISABILITY, ETHNIC GROUP, RELIGION OR NATIONAL ORIGIN.



Advanced Placement/Transfer students are required to meet the same standards for admission in addition to successful completion of Nursing 19. Entry is based on space available.
