Conjunctions are words used to connect clauses or sentences or to coordinate words in the same clause.

Coordinating conjunctions or **FANBOYS**: (for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so)

Adverbial conjunctions similar to the word and: also, besides, furthermore, likewise, moreover

Adverbial conjunctions similar to the word but: however, nevertheless, nonetheless, still

Adverbial conjunctions similar to the word so: accordingly, consequently, hence, then, therefore, thus
