Reminders

- > All SMC students have the right to an education in an environment conducive to learning
- > Students have a right to due process
- > Faculty have the right to teach in an environment free of disruptions and violence
- > Faculty are not required to make accommodations for disruptive students
- > Privacy laws apply to student records

Recommendations

- > Develop departmental/classroom policies and procedures; post, and inform staff or students
- > State rules and expectations clearly, preferably in writing (acceptable v. non-acceptable behavior)
- > Enforce rules consistently
- > Discuss consequences
- > Obtain signature from students or staff indicating that they understand policies
- ➤ Know your student's names
- > Identify and address problems early on
- Ask for help early on-You are not alone!

- > Know your limitations
- > Document intervention, behavior, etc.
- > Do not attempt to retrieve evidence if student tries to destroy it by eating it
