

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

He had planned to continue his education with a Master's Degree program focused on environmental related issues.

At the time of his death, he was spending countless hours coaching children with autism at the SMC Swim Center. He loved animals, nature and humankind. He was concerned with animal cruelty, labor practices, and environmental degradation. In particular, Sam opposed the use of animals for testing or producing materials such as clothing or cosmetics. Sam had an appreciation for organic textiles and fashionable apparel that embraced the principals of sustainability. This scholarship was created for the Fashion Department at Santa Monica College for students with similar interests and priorities. Sustainability, ethics, business practices, global awareness, textile production and fashion trends are all relevant criteria for this scholarship.








Nicole Goodman

The inspiration for my collection is structures and patterns found in gemstones and architecture of different cultures.

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
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




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
