1. Understand, analyze in depth, and perform Monologues and Soliloquies or scenes as needed by utilizing advanced acting techniques.

2. Communicate effectively as a stage performer and develop an awareness of theatre as an art form reflecting man's social experience and cultural heritage.

As assessed by:

- a) Performance of four or more Monologues and Soliloquies in the classroom and in a public performance.
- b) Paperwork turned in by student for each performance.

3. Perform at a highly competent level during auditions for the theatre either for performing jobs or for acceptance to a university or conservatory program.

As assessed by:

- a) Success at auditions and acceptance to a university or conservatory program.

PROGRAM OUTCOME(S):

Upon completion of courses in this department the student will develop the following abilities:

1. Hone performance, design, analytical or technical skills leading to performance in the capacity of at least one of the following: Actor, Director, Stage Manager, Set/ Light/ Sound/ Costume/ Make-Up Designer, Stage Technician, Reviewer, Educated Audience Member.
2. Evaluate and appreciate a theatrical performance by recognizing the inherent components that go into creating theatre, including the research involved, the collaboration among designers and director/s, the rehearsal process and the technical skills involved in making a play come to life.
3. Compete for work (in any of the capacities mentioned in outcome #1) in the professional world, as our student theatre environment is highly representative of what occurs in professional theatre. Students will also develop the skills to compete for a place in an institution of higher learning in the relevant field of study.
