APPLICATION PROCESS

All applicants seeking admission to WCU School of Pharmacy must meet minimum requirements and specified prerequisites. To apply, submit the PharmCAS application and a member of our admissions team will contact you.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- » Completion of prerequisite coursework (63 credit hours or 94.5 quarter hour equivalents) with a cumulative and math & science GPA of 2.50 or higher at a regionally accredited institution in the US.
- » Submit 3 letters of recommendation:
 - 2 letters from a math/science faculty
 - 1 letter from either a pharmacist (supervisor), math/ science professor, employer (supervisor), healthcare professional (supervisor), or liberal arts professor.
- » Submit a completed PharmCAS application.
- » Complete the interview process.

WHAT IS THE HYBRID FORMAT?

The hybrid format blends in-person immersive experiences such as skills labs, networking, student community building, and community engagement opportunities with online synchronous and asynchronous classes.

REQUIRED PREREQUISITE COURSES:

- » Required Prerequisite Courses:
 - Two courses in General Chemistry (four credit hours each, including lab).
 - Two courses in Organic Chemistry (four credit hours each including lab)
 - Two courses in General Biology (with Cell Biology) (four credit hours each including lab).
 - One course in Human/Mammalian Physiology (three credit hours each including lab).
 - One course in Human Anatomy (three credit hours each including lab).
 - One course in Economics (Micro, Macro, or General) (three credit hours).
 - One course in Calculus (with Analytical Geometry) (three credit hours).
 - One course in Statistics (three credit hours).
 - One course in Speech Communication/Public Speaking/Interpersonal Communication or Debate (three credit hours).
 - Two courses in English Composition (three credit hours each).
 - One course in Psychology or Sociology (three credit hours).
 - Two courses in Humanities and Social/Behavioral Sciences (three credit hours each).
 - One course in Biochemistry (three credit hours).
 - One course in Microbiology (three credit hours including lab).
- » Preferred Coursework (not required):
 - Physics with Laboratory (may be non-calculus based) 4 credits/6 credits
