VII. Discussion Items

- **7.1** Campus No Smoking Policy (Guest Speaker Presentation: Chief Al Vasquez)
 - Cameron: Liberal arts sections has been shut down but hasn't stopped smokers.
 - **Brenda Bension(SP):** Dean of counseling and retention. Background history:

SPRN 2008 students voted for campus to be smoke free, went to board of trustees. They passed 7/2008. Met every Tuesday for 9 months. Transitional steps created to go from smoke allowed to smoke free. Needed to get word out with an educational campaign, create signs, banners, designated smoking areas, online. DEC 2008 Trustees approved. Beginning with 140 signs put up round campuses over 40 banners smoke free message posted on SMC website, gave police cards to pass out to students smoking around 3,000 printed, ordered 50 new trashcans around campus to allow smokers to properly dispose of their cigarettes before going through campus. Gloria Lopez, held workshops to help with addictions.

Lance Simpson: Designated 4 smoking areas were seen as a transitional step and temporary until the word is out. Liberal Arts is no longer a designated area, so now there are 3, two on Pico, one on Pearl. Task force talked with DR Tsang: he wants it to be an educational campaign, we don't want to punish or fine smokers Seargent Bottenfield: there is no law to cite smokers. We want this to be an educational process. Environmental design ideas. We can ask people to move but that's it. Hands are tied. It's a policy, not a law so no enforcement is allowed.

20 feet from doorways is Santa Monica is a law.

Cameron: Taskforce looking for new smoking areas.

Linda: Psychological Services, LA SUCKS IN ALL THE SMOKE. Number of offices in there that are working under these circumstances. Being exposed causes lower respiratory infections, cancer, diabetes, etc. Suggest 15 minutes passing patrol, doesn't want to be exposed on a daily basis and looking for a solution.

Hearn: Primary problem the LA area. Recommendation sit with Sergeant Bottenfield, if you have those people move Pathway stairs to get to underground level of parking lot.

Chris: saw problem on pearl.

Lee Peterson: disagrees with Dr.Tsang, who is allowed to discipline those who don't follow smoking designation. 3 may not be enough, your discretion allowed to petition council to disallow.

Nader: Smoker: Wants to appease both sides, non smokers just think the smell is icky and is not a health problem.

Natasha: it definitely is a health issue, compromise is good, should be educational, agree for ashtrays.

Chris: Nader, where would you recommend to place no smoking areas?

Kyle: section to cite someone for littering: students flick cigs onto floor.

Nader: More ashtrays where smoking is allowed.

Cameron: other campuses have no smoking policies.

Cameron Quinn: Make parking structures designated smoking areas.

Leeor: Anti smoking person: can't fully cancel smoking areas out because it will only worsen. Plastic rooms, look into these and cost. Build awareness, and designation areas.

Chantelle: Smoking is a problem as it is in the parking lots, not the best solution.

Ashley: people sleep in their cars.

Natasha: Facilities is for smoking rooms.

Lee Petersons: but huts starts around \$5,000 dollars or more.

Cameron: now that we have pros and cons, let's work as Directors and create Ad Hoc Committee. Taskforce to work still stick w/Dr.Tsang about it being educational. include satellite campuses, not just main campus: Aye, Kyle, Chantelle, Leeor, Laura, Chris, Sarah.

Chief Vasquez: what do you think? Specifically listed in city chapter's to create a sanction, change wording mescal law, and methods to keep the cops from looking as the bad guys.
