**What do I need to
get a job?**

Entry Level Education	Bachelor's degree
Licensure/ Certification	<p>All states require a combination of Education and/or Internship for Licensing. Architects can earn a degree through a program that has been accredited by the National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB).</p> <p>In the State of California, you may pursue an architecture license through the internship program defined below. Some skills would be desired before hiring, but a license can be obtained by doing the required hours solely as an intern under the direction of a licensed architect.</p>
Experience	A 3-year internship minimum is required prior to licensure; some employers prefer candidates with 5-10 years of experience

STEP 1: EDUCATION

- **Associates in Architecture from SMC**
- **Transfer to obtain Bachelor of Architecture (B.Arch.)**

STEP 2: INTERNSHIP

Aspiring architects must complete the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB) Architectural Experience Program (AXP) before they can qualify for a license. This program requires a minimum of 3,740 hours of documented internship under 6 experience areas – covering everything from site design to project management.

The National Council of Architectural Registration Board (NCARB) provides information on education and licensing in Architecture. This is also where you would register to intern and start the examination process:

Success Tip:

Prepare for the Architect Registration Examination (ARE). The NCARB offers study guides and practice exams to individuals intending to take the ARE. These materials might help an individual pass the ARE on their first try.

STEP 3: ARE EXAM

The Architect Registration Examination (ARE) can be taken after an individual has completed the internship requirement. It consists of six areas, including practice and project management, program analysis, project planning and design, project development and documentation, and construction and evaluation. California has a supplemental exam also. Continuing education is required to renew an architect's license. Depending on the state, renewal might be annual or biennial.

STEP 4: CERTIFICATION

Architects can apply for a voluntary certification from the NCARB once they've qualified for and earned a state license. The certification must be renewed annually and may ease the transition of licensing across states.

Architects with 'green' construction or design experience can pursue one of the multiple Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) certifications available through the U.S. Green Building Council. LEED credentials must be renewed every two years by completing 15 hours of continuing education.

Remember, in most states architects need a B.Arch. or M.Arch. degree from a program that has been approved by the National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB) and a state license, which requires completion of a 5,600-hour paid internship.

CALIFORNIA LICENSE

In the State of California, you may pursue an architecture license through a combination of education (5 years maximum) and internship under a licensed architect (minimum of 3 years full time paid internship).

California rules for education and licensing is found with the California Architects Board (CAB). This site also has information on additional testing for California and the education requirements which allow more options to obtaining a license.

1. Do you have the skills?

Identify the skills employers are looking for candidates to have to do this job.

Make sure you list all of the skills you have that they are looking for on your resume in a skills section.

ie. AutoCAD, Adobe Illustrator, Photoshop

If you don't have the skills look for resources to obtain the required skills.

2. Prove it:

Tell a story about a class project in which you applied the skills they are looking for, using the appropriate industry terminology

3. Show it:

Outline those experiences on your resume in a clean, clear and fluid way (and then show the work in your portfolio

Resume General Guidelines

- Do not include every job you have ever had.
- Limit your resume to one page.
- Review your resume for spelling, punctuation, and grammatical errors.
- List your relevant experience reverse chronologically, starting with the most recent experience.
- When you submit your resume to employers send it in PDF format.
- Do not: include pictures, weight/height, or other personal information.
